## Appeal details

The applicant seeks leave to appeal on the following questions of law pursuant to s 296 of the Criminal Procedure Act 2011:

- 1. Was the District Court correct in law to hold that the Domain Board cannot issue a trespass notice because it is not an "occupier" for the purpose of s 4 of the Trespass Act 1980?
- 2. Was the District Court correct in law to hold that Mr Taueki could not be the subject of a valid trespass notice because of the rights reserved to the owners of the Horowhenua XI block under s 18 of the Reserves and Other Lands Disposal Act 1956?
- 3. Was the District Court correct in law to hold that the prosecution must be dismissed

because there was no adequate evidence that the Domain Board had resolved to issue a trespass notice and no evidence that it had delegated the authority to trespass Mr Taueki to the person who served the notice on him?
